

ISSCD Mentee in Mentorship Programme

Thank you for expressing your interest in participating as a Mentor in the M-in-M Programme and for your support of early-career researchers in the field of celiac disease research.

Guidelines for Mentors

1. Mentors must currently be working in a clinical or research capacity within a university, hospital, clinical practice, research institute, or similar professional environment and in a role directly related to celiac disease or strongly linked to the condition.

(For example, this may include but is not limited to; a gastroenterologist treating patients with IBD and celiac disease; a researcher investigating links between celiac disease and other autoimmune conditions; or a specialist dietitian supporting patients with IBD, gluten sensitivity, and celiac disease).

2. Mentors must be able to host their Mentee at their facility for a minimum of two weeks. In addition, Mentors should be based in a different country or region from their Mentee to support the programme's goal of fostering international collaboration, networking, and knowledge transfer.
3. Mentors are expected to actively share their expertise with their Mentee, including insights into current knowledge, innovations, and research in the field of celiac disease.
4. Mentors should facilitate networking opportunities, enabling the Mentee to connect with other celiac disease professionals within their institution and, where possible, the wider region.
5. Mentors will support their Mentee in achieving the objectives of their M-in-M project, which will be agreed upon prior to the commencement of the placement.
